

Economic Implications of Nomad Settlement in Development Centers of West Azerbaijan Province

Abstract

Basically, any development and constructive programs that is being implemented has several effects and consequences. They include economic, social, political and spatial implications. Due to the wide scope of the subject, this paper deals only with economic aspects. The purpose of this paper is to study the effects and economic consequences of nomadic settlements in the three centers of development of Shiblou, Seyyed Abad and Sheikh Marouf in West Azarbaijan province. The research method of this research is documentary survey and data gathering tools are questionnaire, interview and observation. Sharp-Cochran method was used to determine the sample size and sample households were determined based on spatial cluster sampling method. After completing the questionnaires, field information was extracted using SPSS software and data correlation was obtained based on Spearman method. The results showed that after nomadic settlement, their lands increased, the amount of agricultural production increased and tribal income increased. But this increase in income has not led to the satisfaction of the tribes, because tribal expenditures has increased as income increases.
